6. Classes for Competition - Seniors Only

- Single engine 4 Stroke karts using Briggs & Stratton LO206 factory sealed engine or Torini Clubmax factory sealed engine.
- Subaru KX21 engine must be unmodified and are permitted for use with the intention
 of allowing competitors the opportunity to transition into the sealed Briggs 206 and
 Torini Clubmaxx engines. All Subaru KX21 competitors will start rear of field for
 all races and will not be competing for class trophies.

7. Entry

The fee for entry in this event will be \$100 per kart. Driver fee is inclusive with entry fee. Licence shall be a minimum AASA Karting Licence or an approved equivalent. Proof of licence currency will be required.

8. Transponders

Each competitor must supply their own transponder. Each team is responsible for their transponder. Please ensure your transponder is charged and fitted to an appropriate location. Transponders are available for hire for \$30(please indicate this on the entry form if required- only 3 available)

9. Minimum Entries

The minimum number of entries per class shall be nominated by the organisers for each round. If insufficient entries are received the event may be cancelled at the discretion of the organiser.

10. Drivers Briefing

It is *compulsory* for <u>ALL DRIVERS</u> to attend the Drivers Briefing. This will be conducted over the circuit P.A. system in accordance with Covid-19 protocols regarding social distancing. Drivers briefing to be held at 8:00am.

Karts are to remain in Parc Ferme after each race completion until authorised by officials for extraction.







12. Mechanical Breakdown Lane

A mechanical breakdown lane will not be in use. For mechanical repairs karts are to be removed far away from pitlane for this to be undertaken.

13. Abandonment or Postponement

The organisers reserve the right at their sole discretion to abandon, postpone or cancel any event(s).

14. Prizes

Trophies will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd in each Weight Class & a combined team trophy for any kart team entering both weight classes using the same kart – combining points for an overall result

15. Insurance

Insurance has been affected for this meeting as per Section 1 & Section 2 of these Supplementary Regulations as per the AASA Permit.

16. **Fuel**

Pump fuel from any service station 98 octane to be supplied by the competitor

17. Weighing of Karts

The weighing of karts will be done after each race, all karts are to remain within the pit area until karts have been weighed, the pit marshall will instruct competitors when they can leave. Any entry found to be underweight will be excluded from that heat or race.

18. Driving Standards and Penalties

Penalties will be issued at the discretion of the Clerk of Course, these may include timed penalties, place penalties, exclusion from the race or exclusion from the event.

19. Number of tyres

Tyres for this event will be 1 Set of Maxxis Sport Slick Tyre from the start of official practice, and or

1 Set of Dunlop KT12 Wet Tyres from the start of official practice.

Damaged or worn-out tyres (by the way of force majeure) must be reported to and be inspected by the Chief Scrutineer prior to the kart leaving the grid/impound area. Replacement(s) will be at the competitor's cost. Drivers receiving replacement tyre(s) will be required to start at the rear of the grid. The only exception to this is a tyre with a manufacturing defect (as approved by the Chief Scrutineer).

 Wet weather tyres may only be used once the meeting is declared wet by the Chief Steward.







20. . Footwear

Covered footwear MUST be worn in the Paddock / Parc Ferme, Ingrid and outgrid

21. Apparel - Drivers must always wear the following protective apparel.

a. Helmet

Helmet must be full face design with visor. See AASA Appendix 4 - Apparel for detailed specifications. Clear visors must always be used in low visibility and night racing as determined by the Clerk of Course.

b. Driving Suit

Suit must be one-piece design with full length arms and legs. Driving suit is to be secured around ankles and wrist to avoid riding up and exposing arms or legs. Wet weather clothing may be worn but only over the top of clothing listed above.

c. Gloves

Gloves are to cover whole hand and secure firmly around the wrist.

d. Footwear

- i. Shoes & sock are to cover ankles.
- ii. There is to be no exposed skin above the socks when seated in the kart.

22. Safety Equipment

A neck brace, kidney belt or rib protector are not compulsory but highly recommended for the driver's safety.
